

WELCOME TO CHURCH OF THE ASCENSION

The Third Sunday of Easter : 30 April A.D. 2017

Albert Schweitzer in, “The Quest of the Historical Jesus”, offers these words about knowing Christ.

“He came to those men who knew Him not. He speaks to us the same word: “Follow thou me!” and sets us to the tasks which He has to fulfill for our time. He commands. And to those who obey Him, whether they be wise or simple, He will reveal Himself in the toils, the conflicts, the sufferings which they shall pass through in His fellowship, and as an ineffable mystery, they shall learn in their own experience Who He is.”

"Yes, we do meet and learn about Christ in our toils and labors, but first we must have learned about Him in the fellowship of Church. Participation in worship, study and mission with a community is the way we come to know and understand why Christ came to us and how we are saved by his life, death and resurrection.

"Seekers of God seem to know instinctively that they must enter into fellowship with people who know God in order to know God too. Joy in worship is the foundational experience that opens hearts to know God through toils and sufferings. Knowing and loving God means knowing and loving each other in what Martin Luther King called the beloved community. Jesus' Great Commandment to love God with our whole hearts and minds and to love our neighbors as ourselves was given to us in one piece. We must love God and love each other in order to know God. When we all gather on Sundays, and during the week for our groups and our mission work, we enter into the space of church, no matter what we are doing as a holy and sacred space. It is where Jesus promised us in Matthew, that where two or three are gathered in my name, I will be there. Jesus did not promise that we would find perfection when we gather in his name. He promised that he would be there.

"Jesus also told the disciples in the Gospel of John that the community at large would know whom he was and is by the way that they loved each other. That again, did not mean, a love without disagreement or conflict. It meant the way they treated each other in the midst of conflict. So, the fellowship of Church of Christ, is the college of Christ and the incubator of love. It is the place that provides the foundation for those who chose to follow and to obey Christ so that they may come into full knowledge of Him. Church offers the foundation for faith, that allows Christians to learn personally about Christ as Albert Schweitzer described above. It is the foundation that encourages us and strengthens us to endure through all our toils and sufferings. Joy in the fellowship of Christ is the beginning and the end. May we enter the coming year of study, mission and worship with open and joyous hearts knowing that Christ is here, now and forever, no matter what."
