Every Creature Is a Word of God

God brought things into being in order that his [sic]goodness might be communicated to creatures, and be represented by them; and because his goodness could not be adequately represented by one creature alone, he produced many and diverse creatures, that what was wanting to one in the representation of the divine goodness might be supplied by another. For goodness, which in God is simple and uniform, in creatures is manifold and divided.

-Thomas Aquinas, Summa Theologica, I, 47, 1

Each and every creature is a unique word of God, with its own message, its own metaphor, its own energetic style, its own way of showing forth goodness, beauty, and participation in the Great Mystery. Each creature has its own glow and its own unique glory. To be a contemplative is to be able to see each epiphany, to enjoy it, protect it, and draw upon it for the common good. (Some Sundays I am drawn to awe, prayer, and service by the Nature Channel much more than by the morning church service!)

Sister Ilia Delio, OSF, a speaker at some CAC conferences, writes in true Franciscan style: "The world is created as a means of God's self-revelation so that, like a mirror or footprint, it might lead us to love and praise the Creator. We are created to read the book of creation so that we may know the Author of Life. This book of creation is an expression of who God is and is meant to lead humans to what it signifies, namely, the eternal Trinity of dynamic, self-diffusive love" (Christ in Evolution, p. 62).

Meister Eckhart, OP, says it even more succinctly: "Anyone who truly knows creatures may be excused from listening to sermons, for every creature is full of God, and is a book." And that is from one who was a member of the Order of Preachers!

Special Christmastide Offering

Dear Friends and Members of Ascension:

At its most recent meeting on December 17th, the Vestry voted unanimously to take up a special Christmastide collection to support the cause of Henry Sanchez, whose story is related to us by parish member Lucelia Justiniano, an immigration lawyer.

"Henry Sanchez, whose case obtained national attention when he was falsely accused of raping a girl at Rockville High School, was for a time the "poster child", or scapegoat, for anti-immigrant sentiment around the country.

"All charges against Henry were dismissed. In the process, his father Adolfo was detained by immigration authorities, forcing his two other children (ages 21 and 14) out of their apartment. Adolfo was released from ICE (Immigration and Customs Enforcement) custody on a \$20,000 bond (which seems inordinately high since he has no criminal background at all) but the family was able to pull together enough money to pay it through loans from friends.

"After Henry's charges were dismissed, the state released him into ICE custody and now is holding him on a \$40,000 bond which the family is unable to pay. Adolfo's wife (Henry's stepmother) has also struggled greatly with caring for her 9 children since she depended on him to help provide for her children (the youngest 7 living with them are 2, 4, 9, 9, 13, 15, and 21 years old). Henry lived on his own from the age of 14 to 18 when he reunited with his father.

"He has never before been in any trouble with the police here or in his native Guatemala. He endured substantial physical abuse at the hands of his mother while he lived with her in Guatemala and fled Guatemala due to gang threats. There is no doubt that he needs guidance and therapy to overcome his past trauma. However, what he has received so far in this country is downright injustice. Adolfo, Henry, and his two brothers are all currently in deportation proceedings.

"I come across so many devastating stories but I feel like extending a hand to this family will renew their hopes in the U.S.

"Thank you. Lucelia R. Justiniano, Esq."

If you want to make a contribution to Henry's fund, you may write a check to 'Ascension' with 'Henry' in the memo line. We realize that this is a controversial project, and so all of us in the leadership circle want to be available to hear your concerns and questions, if you have any. Our pictures and names are in the narthex (and have been for years), so you know who we are!

We are also starting a bit late, but remember that Christmas lasts until January 6, the Feast of the Epiphany. So if we can have your offering in hand by today we would be most grateful!
